### Prairie Spirit Bus Policy Change Reminder...

Starting this school year, a bus route that is cancelled in the morning due to extreme cold **will run in the afternoon, if** conditions have improved. In the past, if a bus route was cancelled in the morning due to cold weather, it was automatically cancelled for the entire day.

Bus routes cancelled at 6 a.m. due to cold weather will operate on their regular routes at the end of the school day, provided that temperatures reported at 12 noon are warmer than -40 degrees Celsius (combined temperature/windchill). Please see the notes at the end of this message. If the bus will run at the end of the school day, parents will receive notifications through the <u>Versatrans My Stop app</u> and the update will be posted on the Division's <u>website</u> and phone hotline (306-683-2805).

Educational tours and/or extra-curricular travel by bus will operate in the afternoon provided that temperatures reported at 11 a.m. are warmer than -40 degrees Celsius (combined temperature/windchill).

Wheelchair lift equipment will be operational in the afternoon if the combined temperature is above -35 degrees Celsius at 12 noon. The driver will contact the student's family if the lift equipment is operating for the afternoon route.

Notes: • Please see the Division's updated <u>Admin Procedure 805 - Bus Service Cancellation Due to Inclement Weather</u>. The Prairie Spirit Transportation Department uses Environment Canada's data only.

\*\*\* In the instance that the morning route is cancelled but the afternoon route is running ...we assume all students are on the bus unless told otherwise; please ensure your child's afterschool plan is communicated to the classroom teacher if there are changes. We encourage families to be checking My Stop and/or the website regarding bus cancellations.



## **Registering for 2021/2022 Kindergarten**

If your child will be five years old by December 31, 2021 (born in 2016) they will be able to attend Kindergarten next year. Please contact one of the schools in our community to leave your child's name and your contact information so that Kindergarten registration materials may be sent to you when they become available in March. **École Warman Elementary School is a dual-track school offering both French Immersion and English Kindergarten instruction options.** Both programs follow the Saskatchewan curriculum. We are asking families to ensure that students are registered by April 14<sup>th</sup> to guide us in planning for the 2021/2022 school year.

## La Tire

Maple trees are "tapped", and the sap is collected. It is clear and thin, like water. After much boiling, it reduces down to maple syrup.

### How to make La Tire:

You can then take maple syrup and boil it down to make a candy. It is called "maple syrup taffy" or "sugar on snow" or "la tire" (rhymes with "steer", in French). INGREDIENTS

Ingredients:

Maple syrup -- 1 quart

Fresh, clean snow -- a good amount (on a cookie sheet)

Method: Bring the maple syrup to a boil in a large saucepan and simmer until it reaches 240°F on a candy thermometer. Let cool for a couple seconds and then pour in a thin stream over clean packed snow. Let set for a moment to begin to harden. Roll up on a clean popsicle stick and eat.

If you do not have maple syrup or snow, you can make sugar syrup and pour it over shaved ice. It's still delicious!

#### Sugar syrup recipe:

In a sauce pan put: 1 cup brown sugar, Just under a ¼cup water, ¼cup of butter, ½teaspoon maple flavouring Ice: Fill a large, flat pan that is at least 3" deep with snow or shaved ice. Keep in freezer until the taffy is ready. Place sugar, water, butter and vanilla in a heavy saucepan. Bring to a boil and continue boiling until it reaches a soft-ball stage. This does not take very long. Do not boil longer as it will be too hard, like a hard candy. To determine when it is ready to be poured over the snow use a candy thermometer and cook till 240°f. The temperature might sound specific, but if you leave it boiling too long, it will be a brittle piece and if you don't leave it long enough it won't harden enough and be too soft to eat.
