Call to Order - 7pm

- 1) Motion to Adopt Minutes from September. 2021
  - A. Julia Hafford- Motion to Adopt Minutes / -Seerat 2<sup>nd</sup> Motion
- 2) Errors or omissions to the agenda None
- 3) EWES Administrative Report Danielle Olson
  - A. Update on three school goals:
    - i. Literacy goals: helping all of our readers/writers/speakers to improve
      - 1. New initiative week of Nov 1: the whole school drops everything and reads
      - 2. Show our kids how to transition kids back to class with the help of their teachers
      - 3. Working with Section facilitators from around the division to look at some assessment tools for some of our older grades who do not use the Common Assessment Tools
      - 4. Simple things like goal-setting with our students
      - 5. Involving EAs in helping students work towards their goals and providing them with the tools
      - 6. Reviewing parent engagement in literacy goals



### ii. Reconciliation

- 1. School committee has been created for this
- 2. There will be regular newsletter updates
- 3. Focusing on why we have Treaty and Meti flags and have the school come out and take time to educate students about history
- iii. Mental health and well-being for both staff and students
  - 1. Meeting every few weeks
  - 2. Focus relationship between literacy and mental health/well-being
  - 3. Reassuring students that the whole school is doing this together
    - a. Refocusing kids by setting the ambiance (i.e. turning down the lights etc.)
    - b. Idea of "Fun Fridays"
      - i. Students and staff come in on Fridays
      - ii. Encourage socialization
      - iii. Provide juice boxes—just something fun for everyone
- 4) PSSD Board Adin Dereniwski (Danielle Olson read out the Emailed Report)
  - A. Sent regrets for this meeting
  - B. Truth and Reconciliation:
    - i. Board used day to further educate ourselves and took Four Seasons of Reconciliation module and free online resources
    - ii. Further educational workshops and presentations are planned by division staff
  - C. Pandemic funding for Prairie Spirit School Division
    - i. \$6.8 million approved by Ministry
    - ii. \$5.2 million has been spent and/or committed: utilized towards PPE, sanitization supplies, creation of online schools (Spirit E-Learning), for teachers, technology and additional caretaking hours etc.
  - D. PEP (Provincial Education Plan) has been designed by the Ministry of Education. Three interim plans:
    - i. Learning response of students: intended to consider the various ways that students are experiencing the pandemic. Focus on meaningful re-engagement and learning for K-12



- ii. Reading to levels: recognizing that some students reading levels have been impacted, especially disrupted during the early years
- iii. Mental Health and Well-being: supporting learning practices and strategies for staff and students. These will be addressed throughout the school year

## E. Board Strategic Plan

- i. Board is renewing Strategic Plan. This plan is being developed into a Three Year Plan and is planned to be extended into 2024.
  - 1. Reviewing/inviting feedback from parents/stakeholders
- ii. Exploring learning options for families based on their specific needs (in-school learning, Spirit E-Learning, learning at home K-9 and families that need alternatives to Spirit E-Learning—non-technological option and home-based learning.

## 5) Old Business

- A. Christmas games gift to schools
  - a. Most teachers have ordered. Erin Huber has sourced and/or placed orders for most items
  - b. Home Hardware took 15% off the purchase (most purchases from there). All games are IN. Nicole Lacoursiere paid for them today and Erin Huber to pick up
  - c. Erin Huber to source and purchase rest of games/excess games
- B. Gifting Night
  - a. SCC will have to arrange a night to gift wrap
  - b. Erin Huber to send out an email follow-up to decide date and location
- C. Planned to place this order under decentralized funds. This to be amended to put it under the SCC Fundraising/School-Generated Account
- D. Decision still needs to be made about how to utilize \$2000 grant in 2021-2022 year

## 6) New Business

  - a. Set new fundraising goals to best support our School Community, Students and Teachers
    - i. Long-term goals that don't fall under Division umbrella
    - ii. Will discuss more at next meeting
  - b. Set up a fundraising committee within the SCC Board

- C. Four Seasons of Reconciliation course



- a. Taking the course will contribute to the Student Goals/Parent Engagement. This will fall under Decentralized Funds.
- b. Planning to arrange course in early 2022. Vote planned next time and enroll members
- c. Partnering up with Traditions Elementary School for the Storybook Walk
  - i. Planned for early 2022
- d. Partnering more with other SCC's in Warman for more inclusivity and broader pool of collaboration (i.e. planning/share bigger events from all the Warman Elementary Schools as a whole)

#### D. Ideas:

- i. Technology purchases for the future
- ii. Focusing on outside games
  - This ties in with setting up fresh games in a fun way to keep the students occupied and also bringing in fresh games that don't need equipment i.e. Tik Tok games
  - 2. Inspires students utilize their imagination and play without equipment
  - 3. Reviewed bringing in local athletes post-COVID (someone to come in and teach and engage on different types of outdoor play)
- iii. Assembling take-home literacy package for students: providing kids with books, parents with tips, literacy games.
  - 1. Set aside time for staff to plan
  - 2. Use the library as a resource to assemble packages for age/reading level appropriate reading
  - 3. Ties in with mental health initiative
    - a. Encouraging the family connection
- iv. Pizza night for teachers during Parent-Teacher Conferences (2021)
  - 1. Showing appreciation during busy week for teachers and ties into mental health initiative
  - 2. Arrange supper for French K program
