Happy Spring!! It's the season of warmer weather and puddles. Parents please ensure you are sending extra dry clothes with your students. Thanks!




SPRING RUN




Pre-Kindergarten Program

Emergency Response Practice

All schools in our province practice several different types of emergency response drills during the school year.

A <u>Hold & Secure</u> is called when the is a threat or potential danger outside of the building. In this situation all classes remain inside the building, exterior doors are locked, students and staff may continue with activities inside the building under close supervision. A <u>Lockdown</u> may be called when a dangerous situation or significant threat is in very close proximity or is inside the building. Staff and students lock classroom doors and stay quiet and together in a safe secure location.

An <u>Evacuation</u> procedure may occur when all people must leave the school quickly due to a risk inside the school. An example of this situation may be a fire alarm or the smell of natural gas etc.

The staff and students of EWES will continue to practice all of these drills and soon become experts. We look forward to continuing or partnership with local RCMP and appreciate their support and guidance with our practice drills.
