

## LEARNING SUMMARIES

The last day of student attendance is Tuesday, June 28th. Students will receive their final learning summary, homeroom teacher assignment and school supply list for next year on this day. In cases where a student is not planning to be in attendance on the final day of school, we encourage you to contact the <u>homeroom</u> <u>teacher</u> to plan for a friend/neighbor to bring the year-end documents home. Any unclaimed progress reports will be emailed home by the homeroom teacher on Wednesday, June 29.

### **Classroom Placements for 22/23**

Each spring our school engages in an exhaustive process of creating class lists for the following school year.

Our goal is to place students in a setting that is most appropriate for each child individually and for the group; as a whole.

The final placement of a child is a school-based decision that is made using various criteria including:

- Academic needs
- Social needs and dynamics (individual and group)
- Students who require additional intensive/EA support
- Independence/dependance
- Student relationships

Due to the complexities of placing students in classes, decisions are considered complete and final at the end of June.

\*Exception may be if there is significant changes to enrollment numbers over the summer. In the rare event that this may occur, the school office will contact your family in late August if your child will be directly affected. Students will be made aware of who their homeroom teacher is when they receive their June learning summary.
