# <u>Edsby</u>

If you are new to the school, you will have received an invitation to Edsby via email; all returning students' Edsby accounts have been updated with the current school/teacher information. Please ensure you are signed in and checking your account regularly for updated information from the school and your student(s) teacher.

Edsby will be used by teachers to:

- Do their attendance
- Enter grades
- Communicate with parents



As a parent with the app, you will have access to each of your children in one spot, even if they go to different schools. You will be able to use Edsby to do attendance without having to call the office and to engage in your child's progress in their classes. It is the main communication tool for our school/division, ranging from school wide announcements and classroom newsletters to individual contact between parent and teacher. This federal statutory holiday was created through <u>legislative amendments</u> made by Parliament.



# Wear Orange at ÉWES on September 28<sup>th</sup>

There will be no school on September 29<sup>th</sup> in recognition of National Truth & Reconciliation Day on September 30<sup>th</sup>.

Orange Shirt Day is an Indigenous-led grassroots commemorative day intended to raise awareness of the individual, family and community inter-generational impacts of residential schools, and to promote the concept of "Every Child Matters". Healthy Hunger Lunch ordering is offered to all staff and students from K-Grade 6. Please note however, that for kindergarten classes, Healthy Hunger will alternate between Kindergarten A and B Days. <u>Please only order for kindergarten students on their attending day – double check your calendars!</u>

At the end of the school year Healthy Hunger always erases your child(ren) from your account so you will be prompted to add your child(ren) and which grade/teacher they are with for this school year. Please ensure that you select the city/town as Warman and the school as École Warman Elementary School. Once you have added your child(ren) you are then able to place your order. If you are new and have not created an account, please proceed to the Healthy Hunger website, and click the green *Learn More* button under Parents and then sign up for a free account.

• Once you are into your account you will notice that the hot lunch options/dates have been set up for the remainder of the school year (more dates will follow). If you would like to proceed and order all your lunches "available to date" you can. At any time, you may log back into your account to make changes to your orders.

# \*Student Pickup and Drop Off Parking Reminders\*



For the safety of everyone please make sure student drop off/pickups happen in the drop off loops to the West (in front of Before & After School building) or East of our school (behind the staff parking lot – down the alley), in the parking area across from the school or in the alley ways. At NO TIME should parents have students meeting them in the staff parking lot.

Parents must refrain from dropping off or picking up students in the bus lane in the front of the school – even after the buses have pulled away. ÉWES is back to having field trips and buses must stay on schedule, so they must always have access to the bus lanes before, during and after the school day. The bylaw officer will be issuing tickets for those continuing to park in non- parking areas and stopping in bus lanes between the hours of 8am – 3:30pm.

For the safety of everyone, students and adults should be crossing the street at the marked crosswalks.

Drivers, please take extra caution when driving in front of the school. Please be aware that things will slow down during the beginning and end of school times.

#### Air Quality Guidelines (AQHI)

Over the past several months, we have experienced a variety of clear days and smoke-filled days. Our division has responded with guidelines for practice to help us ensure the health of our staff and students is of priority.

We will closely monitor the AQHI daily and respond for both the "general population" as well as our "at-risk population".

Thank you for your help and patience as we learn and implement these new practices.



Air Quality Guide for Schools

Health Risk	Air Quality Health Index	School Messages for Outdoor Activities
Low Risk	1-3	All planned outdoor activities can proceed.
Moderate Risk	4 - 6	All planned outdoor activities can proceed.
High Risk	7 - 10	Recesses and lunch breaks can proceed but allow the option of coming indoors. Consider moving strenuous PE indoors. Consider postponing or adapting extra-curricular events with clean air breaks. Follow all relevant school division guidelines, including Sport and Activity Handbook (Outdoor Education), AP- 418 Learning Activities Outside the School.
Very High Risk	11	Allow for indoor recesses and lunch breaks. Outdoor PE should move indoors. Extra-curricular events should be postponed or moved indoors, if possible. Follow Backcountry/Field Trip/Outdoor Ed Air Quality Guidelines.

#### **Bus Students and Families**

It is always important to take a moment to discuss expectations for behaviour when taking the bus to and/or from school. This privilege also comes with the responsibility to behave appropriately at the bus stop and while riding the bus.

As our school demographic is of a young age and we are all still learning, whenever possible, having an adult, parent or caregiver accompany your child at bus pickup and drop off will reduce unsupervised times and help increase positive behaviours in getting to and from school safely.
