

Students are seeing what it's like to be part of a construction work site. In helping with framing the structure of the duplex units for Habitat, the students were able to see various stages of construction. Currently, the duplexes are being scheduled to move out this Spring. These duplexes will be going to Saskatoon on Ave. W to help families in need of housing.

Starting in the Fall of 2018, Davinci was asked to help out with constructing the new Viking Preschool that is going up in Langham on Main Street. We started with setting up the foundation of the new structure, and then setting up for a concrete pour of the foundation walls in the chilly Fall months. The students then had to learn floor framing theory, and apply it to the worksite to set up the beams and posts to support the floor of the building. In the cold winter months, the construction crew faced adversity while learning theory and new skills alongside their 'team'. With the new semester came a new crew of student carpenters learning the theory and applying it as they built the exterior walls. The next steps of the process will be to frame the interior walls, and then prepare for the roof construction. Following that, they will finish the exterior and interior walls.
