Yearbooks

The long - awaited yearbooks have arrived and are currently in the process of being distributed. Students in attendance at Walter W. Brown School will receive their yearbooks in person. Yearbooks purchased by former graduates, students who no longer attend W. W. Brown School, or former students who have moved away from the community can be obtained in the following ways:

- 1) send an email to the school office giving permission and arranging an appointment for a specific friend or relative to pick up your yearbook(s) on your behalf, or
- 2) send an email to the school office and arrange in advance for a time that you will personally pick up your yearbook(s).

Please note that because of COVID-19 restrictions it is essential that you make prior arrangements with the office before you drop by the school to pick up your yearbook(s).

The 2015-16/2016-17 and the 2017-18/2018-19 yearbooks each contain two separate yearbooks within one cover. Each yearbook devotes approximately 40 pages to each of the school years that it contains. The yearbooks are each bound in a custom cover.

Yearbook publishing and printing is costly, and some years ago when faced with either having to increase the cost of the yearbook or decrease the number of pages in the yearbook, we decided on the latter and selected a forty page format for the yearbook.

Regarding the two year format for the 2015-16/2016-17 and the 2017-18/2018-19 yearbooks: some individuals purchased one year of the school yearbook and not the other year. That was problematic, because each book contains two school years. This problem was solved by subsidizing those yearbook purchases with monies received annually from Lifetouch photographers. (Each year the school receives a specific percentage from Lifetouch for the school photos sold that year. These monies are placed in the general yearbook account and have accumulated annually.)

A sincere thank you to Jason Farthing, Paige Downing, Jan Wenzel, Elissa Brown, Shawn Huber, Rebecca Ryde, and Janice Kozun for their photos from the 2018-19 school year. Their photographic contributions were invaluable in the creation and completion of the 2018-19 Viking yearbook.

Yearbook for 2019-2020

A yearbook for the year 2019-2020 was not produced. Due to a suspended school year and lack of senior student involvement and leadership in the yearbook, it was not possible to produce a yearbook for the 2019-2020 school year.

Purchase price for the 2019-2020 yearbook will be returned to the 32 individuals who ordered the 2019-2020 yearbook. (A deposit for the yearbook was not sent to the yearbook company.)

Orange Shirt Day

We recognized Orange Shirt day at Walter W. Brown on Wednesday, September 30. Students were given the opportunity to learn about the origin of Orange Shirt Day and reflect on the history of residential schools in Canada and their impact on indigenous communities and our country as a whole. This led to many important conversations about the how we might participate in the process of reconciliation and what we can do in our school to make a positive difference. Grade six students created a mural of orange hands, with the phrase every child matters written on each, to symbolize our commitment to create a better Canada for all peoples and ensure children get the chance to grow up in safe, loving communities. It was an important and meaningful day for staff and students.

Terry Fox Walk

Due to Covid-19 the Terry Fox walk that normally happens in partnership with LES didn't happen. But nonetheless, staff and students still did their part to recognize the amazing accomplishment of Terry Fox. Students brought in loonies and toonies to donate to cancer research. Individual classes watched videos and discussed Terry Fox, while others walked around the community.
